#### RESERVING YOUR CAMPSITE

Campsites can be reserved if the troop **guarantees** to camp with 75% of the site capacity. Troops that do not meet the minimum for a site may have to share with another troop. At the discretion of the Camp Director, troops may be moved to a more appropriate site as needs dictate. Site preferences are on a first come, first reserved basis. Signups are taken each Wednesday in camp for those attending in 2020 and opens to all units the following day (Thursday). Preference is given to current and active members of the Adopt Camp Site Program. Large troops that exceed a campsite maximum can reserve an adjacent site.

Your reservation has a guarantee and maximum number. The guarantee number is the minimum number of Scouts your troop will bring to camp and will be charged for that number. We use this guarantee number to plan for adequate overall camp usage, staffing, program supplies, and food. Please provide an accurate guarantee. You cannot exceed your maximum without prior approval.

Reduction of guaranteed youth prior to March 1 will be subject to a \$100 per youth fee

Reduction of guaranteed youth prior to May 1 will be subject to a \$250 per youth fee.

Reduction of guaranteed youth after May 1 will be subject to no refund and full fee paid

A \$400.00 deposit <u>per campsite</u> is required with this application. This deposit can apply to a Scout's or adult's camp fee, <u>but is not refunded or transferable if the troop does not attend camp, regardless of cancellation date</u>.

## **CANCELLATIONS / REFUNDS:**

All deposits and payments are applied to the final camp fee, not to individuals. All refunds will be issued after September 1. Written notice (not email) of cancellations must be made and refunds are subject to a cancellation fee. Cancellation are a whole troop or Cancellations prior to January 1 will forfeit the campsite deposit.

Cancellations prior to March 1 will be subject to a \$400 per campsite and \$150 per youth fee

Cancellations prior to May 1 will be subject to a \$400 per campsite and \$300 per youth fee.

Cancellations after May 1 no refund will be given. This includes no refund for no shows at camp.

Refunds should only be requested for serious illness or injury (a doctor's certification may be requested), or death in immediate family. Other emergencies may be considered; however, refunds are not given for no-shows, conflict of schedule (such as a sports event), weather conditions, or behavior issues.

NOTE: Due to California increasing minimum wage by 10% we are needing to raise our prices. Staff costs and food costs are the largest two expenses at camp during the summer. Unfortunately, the voters have raised the minimum wage and we need raise the cost of camp accordingly. This will continue each year over the next five years as we reach \$15 per hour by 2022.

# YOUTH FEES: Per Scout Fee in council / Out of Council

Reservations made while Troop is at CHS summer camp: \$465 / \$490
Reservations made before November 1: \$495 / \$520
Reservations made after November 1: \$545 / \$570

**ADULT FEES**: Adults Fees: \$325

At 10 Scouts: 1 adult free (min 2 adults required)

Each additional 10 scouts 11, 21, 31,41,51,61, 71, etc. one more free adult, Additional adults pay \$325

**LATE FEES:** All payments are due in full 5/1/19, if not paid in full an additional \$25 per person will be assessed. All late additional youth and adults are an additional \$25 per person.

# **EARLY AND LATE ARRIVALS:**

Some units elect to arrive on Saturday afternoon, after 2:00 PM. The fee is \$15 per person.

Some units cannot travel on Sunday, so they arrive Monday morning. There is no discount for Monday arrivals.

## **PAYMENT SCHEDULE:**

\$400 per campsite is due with the initial reservation

An initial payment of \$150 per youth is due by January 1, 2021

A payment of an additional \$150 per youth is due by March 1, 2021 (to date, \$300/ youth)

The balances of the fees, youth and adults are due no later than May 1, 2021. A roster of all participants is due with this payment, a print off of the online merit badge system is acceptable.

## Full Payment is needed to enable online signups for merit badges.

# **INSURANCE:**

Units within the Silicon Valley Monterey Bay Council do not need to provide proof of their unit accident insurance.

All other units need to provide this information with their final payment.

## **RULES FOR ACCEPTANCE:**

All youth must be registered with the BSA. Each unit must bring and have at least two adults in camp at all times. All leaders staying a cumulative 72 hours must be a registered adult leader with the Boy Scouts of America. At least one leader must be registered and have recently (within two years) taken Youth Protection Training. One adult must be at least 21 years of age. If you have female youth participants, one of your adults must also be an over 21 year old female. Rules for acceptance and participation in all programs are the same without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sex, or handicap.
