RESERVING YOUR CAMPSITE

Any campsite can be reserved for your unit but to guarantee not sharing the site, the troop needs to **guarantee** to camp with 75% of the site capacity. Troops that do not meet the minimum for a site may have to share with another troop or may be moved to a more appropriate site

at the discretion of the Camp Director as needs dictate. Site preferences are on a first come, first reserved basis. Signups are taken each Wednesday in camp for those attending and open to all units the following day (Thursday). Preference is given to current and active members of the Adopt-A-Campsite Program. Large troops that exceed a campsite maximum can reserve an adjacent site.

Linked Troops may share a site, but must complete separate reservations, pay their own campsite deposits, and each provide minimum of 2 leaders.

Your reservation has a guarantee and maximum number. The guarantee number is the minimum number of Scouts your troop will bring to camp and you will be charged for that number. We use this guarantee number to plan for adequate overall camp usage, staffing, program supplies, and food. Please provide an accurate guaranteed minimum number of Scout you will be bring to camp as there are penalties for reducing the number. You cannot exceed your maximum without prior approval.

Reduction of guaranteed youth prior to March 15th will be subject to a \$250 per youth fee.

Reduction of guaranteed youth prior to April 15th will be subject to a \$500 per youth fee.

Reduction of guaranteed youth after April 15th will be subject to no refund and full fee.

A \$750.00 deposit <u>per campsite</u> is required with this application. This deposit can apply to a Scout's or adult's camp fee, <u>but is not refunded or transferable if the troop does not attend camp, regardless of cancellation date</u>. All deposits and payments are applied to the final camp fee, not to individuals.

TROOP CANCELLATIONS / REFUNDS:

All deposits and payments are applied to the final camp fee, not to individuals. All refunds will be issued after September 1. Written notice of cancellations must be made and refunds are subject to a cancellation fee. Cancellations are for a whole troop.

Troop Cancellations prior to January 15 will forfeit the \$750 campsite deposit.

Troop Cancellations prior to March 15 will be subject to a \$750 per campsite and \$250 per youth fee.

Troop Cancellations prior to April 15 will be subject to a \$750 per campsite and \$500 per youth fee.

Troop Cancellations after April 15 no refund will be given, this includes adult registrations. This includes no refund for no shows at camp. Refunds should only be requested for serious illness or injury (a doctor's certification will be requested), or death in immediate family. These refunds are subject to a cancellation fee. Other emergencies may be considered; however, refunds are not given for no-shows, conflict of schedule (such as a sports event), weather conditions, or behavior issues.

At 10 Scouts: 1 adult free (min 2 adults required)

Each additional 10 scouts 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, etc. one more free adult, Additional adults pay \$495

LATE FEES: All payments are due in full April 15th, if not paid in full an additional \$25 per person will be assessed.

All late additional youth and adults are an additional \$25 per person.

EARLY ARRIVALS:

Some units elect to arrive on Saturday afternoon, after 2:00 PM. The fee is \$25 per person.

PAYMENT SCHEDULE:

\$750 per campsite is due with the initial reservation.

An initial payment of \$250 per youth is due by January 15.

A payment of an additional \$250 per youth is due by March 15. (to date, \$500/ youth)

The balances of the fees, youth and adults are due no later than April 15. A roster of all participants needs to be inputted before your merit badge sign-up day in May. **Full Payment is needed to enable online signups for merit badges.**

INSURANCE:

Units within the Silicon Valley Monterey Bay Council do not need to provide proof of their unit accident insurance.

All other units need to provide this information with their final payment.

RULES FOR ACCEPTANCE:

All youth must be registered with Scouting America. Each unit must bring and have at least two adults in camp at all times over the age of 21 who are registered and have recently (within two years) taken Youth Protection Training and Hazardous Weather. All leaders staying overnight must be a registered adult leader with Scouting America. All registered leaders from Troops in California must have taken Mandated Reporter Training and completed LiveScan fingerprinting in accordance with state laws. If any female scouts are attending an over 21 female registered leader must attend. Rules for acceptance and participation in all programs are the same without regard to race, color, national origin, age, sex, or handicap.
